- 2. The examination will be of the MCQ type. There will be a total of 50 questions, all of which need to be answered. All questions will carry equal marks.
- 3. Total time allocation for the examination is one (01) hour.
- 4. Testing will be broadly on the following areas:

Character and Professional Integrity	5

- 5. The Online examination will be monitored in real time using video conferencing with recording.
- 6. Candidates shall face the examination individually from a convenient location of their choice. Ensuring that the location has reliable communication service coverage and reliable power sources to power the device(s) used for taking the examination shall be the sole responsibility of the candidate. AASL shall not assume any responsibility for any eventualities at the candidate's end in this regard.

- 7. The candidate shall be in possession of his/her National Identity Card during the examination.
- 8. The candidate shall be rendered disqualified if any of the following are revealed beyond reasonable doubt, either through online monitoring or through subsequent off-line examination of the recordings, to have taken place during the examination, notwithstanding his/her completion of the examination or his/her performance at the examination:
 - a. Presence of any individual other than the candidate at the immediate vicinity of the location from where the candidate takes the online examination.
 - b. Failure to confirm the identity of the candidate online if called for during any stage of the examination.
 - c. Any attempt to avoid, shield, or be out of the coverage zone of the video conferencing used for monitoring at any time during the examination.
 - d. Any attempt to communicate with a 3rd party either physically or online, to seek assistance or for any other purpose.
 - e. Any attempt to look up or refer support material either physically or online.
 - f. The possession of and/or any attempt to use calculators, portable computing devices, mobile devices other than the device(s) used for taking the examination and/or for being monitored through video conferencing, and wearable smart devices.
